

UNIFIED CALL FOR REGIONAL BENEFITS ACADEMIC YEAR (A.Y.) 2023/2024

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CALENDAR

Students wishing to apply for benefits must complete the online application and send it **by 1 p.m.** (Italian Summer Time/GMT+2/UTC+2/CEST) on the due date indicated in the table, in accordance with the procedures set out in Article 6. ARDIS' electronic online services system certifies the exact date and time of the online application submission. The deadlines are **peremptory**: completing the application after the deadline **results in its exclusion**.

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Article 1 - Benefits envisaged by the call

The benefits envisaged by the call issued by the Regional Agency are the following:

- Scholarships;
- Accommodation places;
- Accommodation contributions for the Portogruaro, Bolzano, Conegliano and Verona sites;
- International mobility contributions.

Article 2 - Recipients of benefits

The recipients of benefits include:

- **Students at the Universities** of Trieste and Udine enrolled for the academic year. 2023/2024 in the following courses:
 - bachelor's degree,
 - master's degree,
 - single-cycle master's degree,
 - specialisation, except for those in the medical area activated based on the relevant regulations,
 - PhD courses, which do not benefit from a scholarship under Ministerial Decree No. 224 of 30 April 1999.
- **Students of the Music Conservatories** "G. Tartini" in Trieste and "J. Tomadini in Udine enrolled for the academic year 2023/2024 in the following courses:
 - level I upper three-year courses,
 - level II specialised two-year courses;
- students enrolled for the academic year 2023/2024 in the first and second level academic diploma in "Graphic Design for the Enterprise" and the first level diploma in "Painting" and "Interior Architecture and Design" at the "G.B. Tiepolo" **Academy of Fine Arts** in Udine.
- **Undergraduate students** regularly enrolled in the last year of a regular course in the academic year 2022/2023 who obtain their degree within the sessions of the same academic year, on or after 25 August 2023.

Students enrolled in single courses, courses aimed at accessing teaching competitions, specialisation courses, specialisation courses for teaching support to disabled pupils and master's courses are **not eligible for the benefits** offered.

Article 3 - Duration of eligibility for benefits

The benefits offered are granted for the **first time for each degree level**. Students already in possession of a qualification, obtained in Italy or abroad, of the same or higher level are therefore not eligible. The level of the degree is determined by universities, conservatories and the Academy of Fine Arts.

University seniority is calculated from the year of first enrolment in the university system, irrespective of any change of course, except for students with disabilities as defined in Article 5 below, for whom it is possible to drop out of studies a maximum of three times.

'Freshman' status cannot be granted to students enrolled in the first year, the 2023/2024 academic year, who have waived their studies in years other than the first year in their previous careers or who have applied for credit recognition.

University seniority starts from the year of first enrolment in the university system even in the case of enrolment in three-year degree courses of the new system for students already in possession of a three-year degree from the old system (prior to the 1999 reform).

University seniority is reset, for one time only, in the event of irrevocable withdrawal from studies during the first year, without recognition of examinations (university credits) from the previous career.

In the event of renewed enrolment following a single drop-out in the first year, without recognition of credits, the student is again considered to be enrolled in the regular first year.

In the event of a **transfer** from another university, or in the event of a request for **credit recognition** or enrolment with a **shortened career**, university seniority is calculated from the year of first enrolment at the university or similar institution of origin.

In the event of enrolment in a single-cycle Master's degree course in Law with a **shortened career**, because the holder holds a Bachelor's degree in "Interlingual Communication Applied to the Legal Professions" and in "Law for Businesses and Institutions", one year is deducted from the university seniority.

In the event of enrolment in courses with **programmed access following a change of course**, renunciation or transfer from another university, which occurred at the end of the first year of the course, this year is not taken into account for the purposes of calculating seniority.

In the case of recognition by the University of credits from previous careers at Higher Technological Institutes (I.T.S. ACADEMY) of Trieste, Udine, Gorizia and Pordenone, university seniority starts from the first year of enrolment at the I.T.S. ACADEMY.

For the purposes of calculating university seniority, the years of enrolment in master's courses for which credit recognition has been requested are taken into account.

The calculation of university seniority excludes the years of enrolment in single courses for which recognition of credits obtained during these courses has not been requested or have not been declared for the purposes of achieving the merit requirement in the online application, as well as the years of university interruption as specified in Article 9, paragraphs 4 and 5, of Legislative Decree 68/2012.

In the event of career disqualification, ARDIS reserves the right to assess the individual situation following specific checks with the University, the Academy and the Conservatoire.

3.1 Students enrolled in courses at the University, Conservatoire and Academy of Fine Arts

Students can access benefits **up to the first supplementary year (further semester)** in the following ways:

<p>Bachelor's degree Upper Level I of the Conservatoire/Academy</p>	<p>Benefits are awarded for seven semesters from the year of first enrolment, eight semesters for the accommodation service.</p>
<p>Master's degree Conservatoire's specialised Level II course</p>	<p>Benefits are awarded for five semesters from the year of first enrolment in the Master's degree course, six semesters for the accommodation service.</p>
<p>Single-cycle degree</p>	<p>Benefits are prorated over a period that takes into account the normal duration of the study course plus one semester from the year of first enrolment, plus two semesters for the accommodation service.</p>

The amount of the scholarship for undergraduates and students enrolled in the first supplementary year is halved.

3.1.1 Bachelor's degree students enrolling in the first year of a Master's degree course

Students graduating from a three-year degree course by the last graduation session of the academic year 2022/2023 and enrolling in the first year of the Master's degree for the academic year 2023/2024 by the deadlines set by the University, **must compulsorily complete the application** for benefits as **master's degree**

students.

3.1.2 Undergraduate students who do not succeed in obtaining a degree or who do not enrol in the first year of a master's degree

Students who have applied, declaring their intention to graduate within one session of the academic year 2022/2023, if they do not succeed in obtaining the degree or, if they have applied as first-year undergraduates, do not enrol in that course, must notify us promptly and in any case by 30/04/2024 by sending an email to: info.trieste@ARDIS.fvg.it or info.udine@ARDIS.fvg.it.

In this case, they will only retain the benefit if they meet the enrolment and merit requirements for the academic year 2023/2024 for students enrolled in subsequent years.

3.2 Students enrolled in specialisation and PhD courses

Students enrolled in specialisation courses, with the exception of those in the medical area activated based on the regulations in force on the subject and PhD courses, who do not benefit from the scholarship pursuant to Ministerial Decree no. 224 of 30 April 1999, may access the benefits for a period **equal to the duration envisaged by the respective didactic structure**, starting from the academic year of first enrolment. There are no benefits for academic years exceeding the legal duration of the course.

Article 4 - Eligibility Requirements

To obtain the benefits, students must meet the **enrolment, merit, income** and **assets** requirements and any additional specific requirements for each benefit as defined in this call.

4.1 Entry Requirements

Prior enrolment in universities, conservatoires and academies is not required to apply for benefits; however, enrolment must take place **within the deadlines** set by the individual institutions.

For students applying for benefits for an **additional semester (undergraduates)**, the enrolment requirement is deemed to have been met if they were duly enrolled in their final year in the academic year 2022/2023 and obtain their degree by the extraordinary session of the same academic year or if they enrol in the first supplementary year with respect to 2023/2024 by the deadlines set by each institution.

Undergraduates are not eligible for the scholarship if they:

- obtain their title before **25 August 2023**
- graduate in a session of the academic year 2022/2023 and continue their studies for the academic year 2023/2024 at a University, Conservatoire or Institution outside the Friuli Venezia Giulia region (with the exception of Master's degrees).

4.2 Merit requirements

Merit for students is calculated based on regularly registered university credits (CFU) or equivalent.

For Conservatoire and Academy courses read CFA instead of CFU.

The following credits are not considered valid for merit and therefore are not taken into account:

- **Credits acquired prior to enrolment in their degree course.** Exceptions to this are cases of recognition of credits resulting from a transfer from another university or from a change of degree course or career shortening, without prejudice to the assessment of the accumulation of years of university enrolment.
- **Credits arising from career steps taken to clear educational debts** from previous careers.

- **Credits arising from career acts relating to individual courses** for which recognition of credits obtained during those courses has not been requested or, even if recognised, have not been declared for the purposes of meeting the merit requirement in the online application.
- **Credits arising from career acts relating to didactic activities related to extra exams.** Please note that even in the case of enrolment in a Master's degree with recognition of extra exams deriving from a Bachelor's degree, these credits will not be counted for the purpose of achieving the 20 CFUs as the minimum merit requirement for first-year students to receive the balance of the scholarship
- **Credits arising from integrated examination modules**, which are not routinely registered in the career in the Esse3 system until the integrated examination is completed.

However, ARDIS reserves the right to verify special situations relating to administrative procedures concerning students' university careers.

4.2.1 Students enrolled in the first year

Students **enrolling for the first time in the first year** of the courses, when submitting their online application, do not need any merit requirement for inclusion in the ranking list of the various benefits as eligible and beneficiary.

Students enrolled for the first time in the first year of these courses are granted the first and second instalments of the scholarship based on their fulfilment of the financial condition requirements set out in this call.

Merit requirements are assessed on an ongoing basis, for the purposes of retention and payment of the third instalment of the scholarship.

From the academic year 2023/2024, the scholarship for **students enrolled in the first year of bachelor's or master's degree programmes and single-cycle degree** programmes is paid as follows:

- **First instalment equal to 20% of the net amount of the scholarship by 10 November 2023**, provided that the enrolment is completed by the deadline for submitting requests for review with regard to the provisional ranking list.
- **Second instalment for a further 30% of the net amount of the scholarship by 31 December 2023.**
- **Third instalment equal to the remaining 50% of the net amount of the scholarship, paid upon reaching of at least 20 credits regularly registered** in the Esse3 system, or in the Conservatoire and Academy databases **(or at least 10 credits for courses with exclusively annual examinations)** with a **passing date no later than 10 August 2024. The achievement of credits will be checked on 30/04/2024 and 10/08/2024.**

From the academic year 2023/2024, the grant for students **enrolled in the first year of master's degree or diploma courses** is provided as follows:

- **First instalment equal to 50% of the net amount of the grant by 31 December 2023**, depending on admission to the courses in accordance with the course regulations and recognition of at least 150 CFUs (CFAs).
- **Second instalment equal to the remaining 50 % of the net amount of the scholarship, paid from June**, upon achievement of at least 20 credits, duly registered in the Esse3 system, or in the databases of the Conservatoires and the Academy (or at least 10 credits for courses with exclusively annual examinations) with a passing date no later than 10 August 2024. **The achievement of credits will be checked on 30/04/2024 and 10/08/2024.**

For the purposes of attaining the credits required for the payment of the scholarship, any credits awarded as a result of a waiver or transfer shall not be considered valid and the bonus referred to in Section 4.2.3 may not be used.

Failure to obtain the prescribed credits by 30 November 2024 will result in the revocation of the scholarship and other cash benefits (Art. 24) with the obligation to repay the amount received.

4.2.2 Students enrolled in years subsequent to the first year

Students enrolled in years subsequent to the first year must meet the following **merit requirement by 10 August 2023** to qualify for benefits:

* The credits indicated for the master's degree and for the two-year specialised level II course are understood to be acquired by students in the master's or specialised course only.

** To be added to the last year of the course.

Please note: In the case of withdrawals/transfers/course changes with credit recognition, university seniority affects the merit requirement.

The credits indicated in the table must be duly registered in the Esse3 system or in the databases of the Conservatoires and the Academy **with a passing date of the relevant examinations no later than 10 August 2023**.

In the online application, students are required to declare, under their own responsibility, the number of credits regularly registered in their career (on the Universities' Esse3 system or in the Conservatoires' database), excluding credits that are not valid for the fulfilment of the merit requirement.

For degree courses whose organisation envisages annual courses with a number of attainable credits lower than 60, as communicated by the universities of Trieste and Udine, the standard merit requirements are redefined in proportion to the credits actually attainable, appropriately indicated in the table attached to this call. (Annex 3)

4.2.3 Bonus

Students **enrolled in years subsequent to the first year** accrue, depending on the year attended, a bonus in CFUs that can be used to **achieve the minimum merit requirement**, in addition to the credits actually earned. The accrued bonus may be:

- **Up to 5 credits**, if used for the first time to obtain benefits for the **second academic year**.
- **Up to 12 credits**, if used for the first time to obtain benefits for the **third academic year**.
- **Up to 15 credits**, if used for the first time to obtain benefits for the following academic years.

Activation of the bonus takes place:

- a. At the applicant's request in an **online application**.
- b. **Ex officio** if bonuses are necessary to achieve the minimum merit requirement.

The verification of the actual bonus credits available is done ex officio. Students can check the use of the bonus by accessing their online reserved area of the "Sportello studente" (Student's Desk), in the rankings for the various benefits claimed.

The bonus can only be activated once and cannot be cumulated. The portion of the bonus not used in the academic year of activation may be used in subsequent years.

Students who benefited from the bonus in the academic years prior to 2023/2024 may only use the unused portion of the bonus. Bonus credits that may have been claimed in academic years prior to 2023/2024 are not taken into account for the minimum merit requirement under this call.

Students enrolled in master's degree courses or two-year specialisation courses may only use the bonus accrued and not used in the previous three years.

Any unused bonus points can be used to reach the merit requirement for the further semester.

Students must declare any use of bonus credits at other universities in previous careers.

ARDIS reserves the right to carry out a random check on the veracity of the information declared regarding bonus credits used in previous careers, following the publication of the final rankings.

Bonus credits cannot be used to achieve the first-year merit requirement (both Bachelor's and Master's degrees).

4.2.4 Students enrolled in PhD and specialisation courses

Students enrolled in specialisation courses, with the exception of those in the medical area activated based on the regulations in force on the subject and PhD courses that do not benefit from a scholarship from the Universities pursuant to Ministerial Decree no. 224 of 30 April 1999, must be in possession of the requirements laid down by the same for regular enrolment in the current academic year.

4.3 Income and asset requirements

The benefits governed by this call fall under subsidised social benefits. Students' economic conditions are identified based on the "**Indicatore della Situazione Economica Equivalente**" (**ISEE**) (**Equivalent Financial Situation Indicator**) for subsidised benefits related to the right to university education, for 2021 income and assets.

Specifically:

- The Equivalent Financial Situation Indicator (ISEE) for **subsidised benefits related to the right to university education** must not exceed the limit of **EUR 26,306.25**;
- The Equivalent Asset Indicator (ISPE= ISP/equivalence scale) must not exceed the limit of **EUR 57,187.53**.

The above **conditions must be fulfilled simultaneously**. The applicant must therefore have an **ISEE value** for subsidised benefits related to the right to university education, and at the same time an **ISPE value** that **does not exceed the thresholds** indicated above.

ATTENTION

Scholarships provided by ARDIS are exempt from tax returns, but the amounts must be reported in the ISEE. In your reserved area under "Sportello studente" (Student's Desk), you will find the Unified Certification certifying the amount obtained from ARDIS as a grant or other contribution to be declared.

The following students:

- a) EU and non-EU citizens, resident in **Italy**, whose family unit residing in Italy has earned income and has assets in Italy and/or abroad, must go to **any CAF** (Tax Assistance Centre) to submit the documents required to obtain the ISEE certificate for subsidised benefits related to the right to university education concerning 2021 income and assets in 2021 and complete the relative DSU (Dichiarazione Sostitutiva Unica - Unified Substitute Return).
- b) EU and non-EU citizens, **resident in Italy**, with a family nucleus resident abroad and/or with income and assets produced or owned abroad are in any case required to declare any income and assets owned in Italy by their family nucleus in accordance with the procedures set out in this call. For this reason, they must go to **any CAF** (Tax Assistance Centre) to submit the documents required to obtain the ISEE certificate for subsidised benefits related to the right to university education concerning 2021 income and assets in Italy and then go **exclusively to affiliated CAFs** for the issue of the University ISEE ("ISEE parificato universitario") (ISEE indicator data sheet). The issue of documentation is free of charge. The opening hours and addresses of the affiliated CAFs are published at www.ARDIS.fvg.it.

- c) EU and non-EU citizens who do **not reside in Italy** and whose family nucleus resides abroad must apply **exclusively to affiliated CAFs** for the issuance of the University ISEE ("ISEE parificato universitario") (ISEE indicator data sheet). The issue of documentation is free of charge. The addresses of affiliated CAFs are published at www.ARDIS.fvg.it.
- d) **Recognised as political refugees** in Italy must attach the certification issued by the Ministry of the Interior. **Stateless students** must attach the certified copy of the documentation issued by the Civil Court. For these categories, only income received in Italy and any assets held in Italy are taken into account.
- e) **Coming from the developing countries** referred to in Ministerial Decree no. 115 of 28-2-2023 "Definition of the list of particularly poor countries for the academic year 2023/2024" and listed in appendix 2, must submit an **assessment of their economic condition** carried out based on a certificate issued by the Italian Representation in the country of origin certifying **that the student does not belong to a family known to have a high income and high social standing**.
In the case of students enrolling in the first year, this certification may be issued by Italian bodies authorised to provide a guarantee of financial coverage under the current provisions on the enrolment of foreign students in Italian universities. In this case, the guaranteeing institution undertakes to repay the scholarship on behalf of the student in the event of revocation.

The "Dichiarazione Sostitutiva Unica" (DSU) (Unified Substitute Declaration) is a document containing the income and asset information needed to describe the household's economic situation in order to apply for subsidised social benefits, such as scholarships.

The information contained in the "Dichiarazione sostitutiva unica" (DSU) is partly self-declared and partly acquired directly from the administrative archives of the Agenzia delle Entrate (Italian Revenue Agency). INPS makes available the ISEE certificate for subsidised benefits related to the right to university education within ten working days of receiving the DSU.

Students must enter in the **online** application the **INPS registration number of the ISEE certificate for subsidised benefits related to the right to university education** referred to them; based on this number, ARDIS automatically extracts the data relating to the ISEE certificate from the INPS database.

By the deadline for completing the online application for each benefit, students must have the registration number of the ISEE certificate or the number of the "Dichiarazione sostitutiva unica" (DSU).

Students under **b), c)** and **e)** above must declare to have obtained an equal university ISEE by the deadline for completing the online application for each benefit. The affiliated CAFs will transmit the relevant computer records. The students concerned do not have to enter the registered number in the online application.

For the purposes of applying for the benefits referred to in this call, **only the ISEE certificate for subsidised benefits related to the right to university education referring to the applicant student is valid. An ordinary ISEE certificate is not valid, even if it refers to the applicant student.**

Students enrolled in doctoral courses (resident or non-resident in Italy) may opt for a different constitution of the family unit for access to benefits pursuant to Article 8, paragraph 4 of Prime Ministerial Decree no. 159/2013, as amended.

From the day following the day on which the ISEE registration number is entered in the completed online application, it is possible to check, within one's own reserved area in "Sportello studente", in the "Redditi Inps Accertati" (Ascertained Inps Income) section, the result of the automated extraction from the INPS database and, in the event of errors, to independently rectify the aforementioned ISEE registration number in the online procedure "Comunicazione dati isee" (ISEE data communication), entering a new one.

ATTENTION

A student who has submitted an online application will be excluded from the requested benefit if by the deadline for submitting a **request for reconsideration**, envisaged for each benefit, an ISEE certificate valid for subsidised benefits related to the right to university education referring to him/her is not available from INPS or the affiliated CAFs, relating to income and assets in 2021.

Students in possession of a **current ISEE**, instead of an ISEE for subsidised benefits related to the right to university education, must communicate the relevant registration number exclusively to: info.trieste@ARDIS.fvg.it or info.udine@ARDIS.fvg.it by the deadline for submitting the online application for

each benefit. As the current ISEE is valid for six months, this certificate is considered as long as it is valid on the date of application for each benefit.

4.3.1 Status of students independent of their families of origin

Students are considered independent of their family of origin if they meet both of the following requirements:

- **Residence** established for at least **two years** with respect to the date of submission of the application for the first time for each course, as evidenced by the personal records, outside the family unit of origin in accommodation not owned by a member of the family unit.
- **Presence of an adequate income** for at least two years, consisting of tax-declared employment income or assimilated income, not lower than **EUR 9,000.00** per year with reference to a household of one person.

In such a case, students may submit an ISEE for subsidised benefits related to the right to university education by setting up their own nucleus.

For the purposes of quantifying the amount of the scholarship, these students are treated in the same way as students with **off-premises** status.

Article 5 - Students with disabilities (pursuant to Article 3(1) of Law no. 104 of 5 February 1992 or with a disability of 66% or more)

Students with disabilities may access benefits **up to and including the second year out of the course (additional semester)** from the first year of enrolment.

Disability data are taken directly from the Universities/Conservatories/Academy database.

5.1 Entry Requirements

The entry requirements are the same as in Article 4.1.

5.2 Merit requirements

Students with disabilities, who **enrol for the first time in the first year** of their courses, do not need the merit requirement when submitting their online application for inclusion in the ranking list for the various benefits as eligible and beneficiary.

These students are granted the first and second instalments of the scholarship based on their fulfilment of the financial condition requirements set out in this call. Merit requirements are assessed on an ongoing basis for the purposes of maintaining eligibility and disbursement of the third instalment of the scholarship

From the academic year 2023/2024, the scholarship for **students enrolled in the first year of bachelor's or master's degree programmes and single-cycle degree** programmes is paid as follows:

- **First instalment of 20% of the net amount of the grant by 10 November 2023**, provided that enrolment is completed by the deadline for submitting applications for review of the scholarship;
- **Second instalment for a further 30% of the net amount of the scholarship by 31 December 2023.**
- **Third instalment equal to the remaining 50% of the net amount of the grant, paid starting from June, upon achievement of at least 9 credits, duly registered** on the Esse3 system, or in the Conservatoire and Academy databases with a **passing date no later than 10 August 2024.**

From the academic year 2023/2024, the scholarship for students **enrolled in the first year of master's degree or diploma courses** is provided as follows:

- **First instalment equal to 50% of the net amount of the grant by 31 December 2023**, depending on admission to the courses in accordance with the course regulations and recognition of at least 150 CFUs (CFAs).
- **Second instalment equal to the remaining 50 % of the net amount of the grant, paid from June**, upon achievement of at least 9 credits, duly registered in the Esse3 system, or in the Conservatoire and Academy databases with a passing date no later than 10 August 2024.

For the purposes of attaining the credits required for the payment of the scholarship, any credits awarded as a result of a waiver or transfer shall not be considered valid and the bonus referred to in Section 4.2.3 may not be used.

Failure to obtain the prescribed credits by 30 November 2024 will result in the revocation of the grant and other cash benefits (Art. 24) and the return of any money received.

The merit requirements **for students enrolled in subsequent years** must be acquired **by 10 August 2023** and are **reduced by 30% with respect to those indicated in Article 4.2.2 above**, as specified in the table below.

* the credits indicated for the master's degree and the two-year second-level degree are understood to be acquired by students in the master's or specialised course.

** to be added to the last year of the course.

Please note: In the case of withdrawals/transfers/course changes with credit recognition, university seniority affects the merit requirement.

The CFUs indicated in the table must be duly registered in the Esse3 system or in the databases of the Conservatoires and Academy **with a passing date of the relevant examinations no later than 10 August 2023.**

The provisions of Art. 4.2 concerning the validity of credits and Art. 4.2.3 concerning the use of bonus credits apply to students with disabilities of at least 66%.

5.3 Income and assets requirements

The income limits, increased by 25% with respect to the values indicated in Article 4.3 above, are as follows:

- Equivalent Economic Situation Indicator (ISEE) for university entitlement benefits not exceeding the limit of **EUR 32,882.81**
- Equivalent Financial Situation Indicator (ISPE= ISP/equivalence scale) not exceeding the limit of **EUR 71.484,41.**

For students with disabilities, the other provisions on income and assets requirements in Article 4.3 apply.

Article 6 - Submission of applications

Students must complete the application exclusively online at www.ARDIS.fvg.it and send it in **by 1 p.m.** (Italian Summer Time/GMT+2/UTC+2/CEST) **on the day indicated in the calendar**. The electronic system certifies the exact date and time the application was sent.

To complete the online application, students **must identify themselves via SPID**, the public digital identity system (see www.spid.gov.it), via CIE (electronic identity card) or eIDAS for EU students only.

Non-EU students, in possession only of an identity document issued by the authorities of their own country, and non-resident in Italy, and under-age students (Italian and foreign) must identify themselves in the following manner:

- For **Trieste**, by **registering online on the Esse3 site** for students enrolling at the University of Trieste (credentials are active within 24 hours of registration, otherwise students must contact the Trieste ARDIS office)
on the ARDIS site for students enrolling at the Conservatoire.
- For **Udine**, by **registering online at the ARDIS website** (if not yet enrolled at the University or if enrolled at the Conservatoire or Academy) or by using **the credentials (student number and password) provided by the University of Udine**, if already enrolled at that university.

The **online application is unified**: students wishing to apply for multiple benefits need **only fill in the application once, selecting all the benefits of interest**.

An online application for more than one benefit must be mandatorily submitted by the first deadline under this call in relation to the benefits applied for.

Having entered the personal online area, students must complete the application by:

- Entering or modifying their personal data and uploading a copy of a valid identity document.
- Entering or modifying information on registration, merit and economic situation.
- Selecting the required benefits.
- Check the application summary containing the data entered, which will remain editable until the online application is submitted.
- **Submitting the application online by confirming the entered data; following this submission, the data become final.**

Extreme care is recommended when completing the online application, as the data entered by students are declarations pursuant to Presidential Decree 445/2000, therefore students are responsible for their truthfulness and completeness.

Certainty of the successful submission of the application only occurs upon receipt of the automatic confirmation email that is generated once the online procedure has been completed. The email will provide the student with information on the availability of the online application summary within his/her "Student Desk" area. **The student is obliged to check the data in the summary and ensure that he/she has applied for the specific benefits in which he/she is interested.**

Please note that the email box from which the confirmation email is sent is not enabled to receive any communication.

If students do not receive the confirmation email within 24 hours of submitting the online application, they must immediately contact the IT support service (assistenza.informatica@ARDIS.fvg.it).

Applications submitted are not considered valid:

- If submitted beyond the deadlines indicated in the calendar.
- If submitted by means other than those provided for in this call.

ATTENTION

Log files are kept and used to monitor students' access to the system in case they report difficulties or inability to complete the online application.

Corrections to entered data can be requested by e-mail at info.trieste@ARDIS.fvg.it or info.udine@ARDIS.fvg.it by the deadline for submitting the online application in relation to the requested benefits.

Pursuant to Law 241/1990 and Regional Law 7/2000, the start of the procedure is published on the institutional website of ARDIS www.ARDIS.fvg.it, in the section dedicated to the Unified Call, and this publication constitutes individual notification of the procedure's start.

6.1 Students not yet enrolled

Students who have not yet completed their enrolment at the university, conservatoire or academy may **apply online subject to** the deadlines set out in the call. Registration must in any case take place within the time limits set out in Article 4.1.

Students who do not finalise their enrolment at the University, Conservatoire or Academy must give timely notice by email to: info.trieste@ARDIS.fvg.it or info.udine@ARDIS.fvg.it depending on the location where the online application was submitted.

6.2 Udine-Trieste inter-university students

Students enrolled in inter-university degree courses between Udine and Trieste must submit an online application for benefits to the competent ARDIS office with reference to the **administrative location of the degree course** (the university where the student pays fees) and must also indicate the prevailing academic location.

6.3 Non-EU students - Additional documentation

ARDIS verifies with the databases of the university institutions of reference that students have submitted to them **either a copy of their residence permit or a copy of the postal receipt attesting to the request** for its issue or renewal.

Further documentation to be uploaded online (upload) in the upload section of the "Student Desk":

- **Certification issued by the Ministry of the Interior** for students recognised as **political refugees** in Italy.
- A **certified copy of the documentation issued by the Civil Court** for **stateless students**.
- Certification **from the Italian Representation in the country of origin** stating that the student does not belong to a family known to be of high income and high social standing for **students who are citizens of developing countries** (listed in Annex 2).

The deadline for uploading this documentation online is the deadline for submitting **applications for review** of the respective benefit rankings.

6.4 Transfer of application from another education authority

The transfer of an application for benefits from another similar entity to ARDIS is permitted, provided that the application was submitted within the deadline set by the other entity. The transfer application, complete with the scan of the one previously submitted to the other institution, must be sent exclusively to the address ARDIS@certregione.fvg.it, within the time limits set for applying for a review of each benefit.

6.5 Transferring the application between ARDIS locations

The transfer of an application for benefits from one operating site to another is permitted provided that the application is submitted within the deadlines for the individual benefits. The transfer application must be sent, exclusively, to the address: ARDIS@certregione.fvg.it.

The transfer of the accommodation benefit application must be received within the deadline for applying for a review of that benefit.

For other benefits, the transfer of the application may be requested by 30/04/2024.

Article 7 - Procedures for the rankings

ARDIS prepares ranking lists for the granting of individual benefits. The number of beneficiaries is determined in proportion to the number of students admitted to the competition who are enrolled in the relevant didactic centres or areas compared to the total number of students eligible for the competition, taking into account the allocation reserves set out in the call.

7.1 Students enrolled in the first year

For students enrolled in the first year of the courses, the rankings are drawn up based on the ISEE indicator for subsidised benefits for the right to university education, with the assignment of points in descending order from a maximum of 1,000 points if the ISEE for subsidised benefits for the right to university education is equal to EUR 0 to a minimum of 0 points if the ISEE for subsidised benefits for the right to university education is equal to the reference threshold. The score is calculated by applying the following formula:

$$SCORE = \left[\frac{(REFERENCE\ THRESHOLD) - ISEEU}{REFERENCE\ THRESHOLD} \right] \times 1000$$

7.2 Students enrolled in specialisation and PhD courses

For students enrolled in specialisation courses, with the exception of those in the medical area activated based on the regulations in force on the subject, for students enrolled in PhD courses, who do not benefit from the scholarship pursuant to Ministerial Decree no. 224 of 30 April 1999, the rankings are the same for students enrolled in the first year and subsequent years and are drawn up based on the ISEE indicator for subsidised benefits related to the right to university education, with the assignment of a score in descending order from a maximum of 1,000 points if the ISEE for subsidised benefits is equal to 0 euro to a minimum of 0 points if the ISEE for subsidised benefits is equal to the reference threshold. The score is calculated by applying the following formula:

$$SCORE = \left[\frac{(REFERENCE\ THRESHOLD) - ISEEU}{REFERENCE\ THRESHOLD} \right] \times 1000$$

7.3 Students enrolled in years subsequent to the first

For students enrolled in years subsequent to the first year on courses activated after the reform pursuant to Ministerial Decree no. 509 of 3 November 1999, as amended by Ministerial Decree no. 270/2004, the rankings for all competitions are drawn up based on merit, with a score in descending order, starting from a maximum total score awarded to the applicant of 1,000 points.

The score is calculated by applying the following formula:

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With regard to the approximation criteria, rounding is done downwards if the decimal is less than half, upwards if the decimal is equal to or greater than half.

The same provisions apply to students enrolled at the Conservatoires and the Academy, insofar as they are compatible.

7.4 Score parity

In the case of students enrolled in years subsequent to the first year, in the event of equal points (calculated to the second decimal place), preference is given to those with a less favourable economic situation.

For students enrolled in the first year of the course, priority is given to the younger students in the event of a tie.

Article 8 - Publication of rankings

ARDIS draws up separate provisional and final rankings for each benefit, deadline and location, which are **published on www.ARDIS.fvg.it. Publication counts as communication to the students regarding the outcome of the competition.**

Students are entered in the rankings by **user code**, and not by name, to meet transparency/privacy obligations. The code, assigned to each student by the software when completing the online application, can always be found in the "Student Desk" reserved area or in the application summary file: the user code consists of the **last five digits of the "Application" code**.

Students can check the outcome of the rankings by accessing their reserved area of the **"Student Desk"**. Communications published in the "Student Counter" are considered to be legal notifications. Therefore, students are required to visit their reserved area periodically.

Article 9 - Requests for review

Any requests for review concerning the outcome of the ranking list must be submitted **peremptorily** within 3 days following the publication of the provisional rankings or within the deadline that will be indicated on the website www.ARDIS.fvg.it.

The publication of the provisional rankings will include the instruction for submitting applications for review. Requests for review submitted beyond the deadline or by other means will not be considered.

Requests for review that refer to ISEE certificates relating to income and assets other than those indicated in Article 4.3 above will not be considered.

In any case, ARDIS reserves the right to make changes ex officio, based on facts of which it becomes aware, also upon notification by the Universities, the Conservatories or the Academy.

The outcome of the request for review becomes final with the publication of the final rankings. An appeal may be lodged against the decision of ARDIS with the competent Regional Administrative Court within 60 days or with the President of the Republic within 120 days from the date of publication of the rankings.

Article 10 - Checks on merit and economic conditions

ARDIS checks the truthfulness of the declarations produced by students who are beneficiaries or eligible, carrying out the necessary checks, also with the help of professionals in the sector, making use of the regulations in force and in particular of art. 10, paragraphs 1 and 2, of Legislative Decree no. 68 of 29 March 2012.

ARDIS exchanges information with the relevant bodies and administrations.

Assessments of economic conditions are carried out digitally with INPS and the Internal Revenue Agency.

Checks on merit conditions are carried out during the academic year with the universities via the Esse3 system or by requesting confirmation of declared data from the secretariats of the Conservatoires and the Academy.

ATTENTION

Students are invited to check that examinations taken or credits accrued have been duly registered **no later than 10 August 2023** in the Esse3 system.

In the event of **untruthful declarations**, in addition to the **sanctions** provided for by law, students will be subject to those provided for in Art. 10, paragraph 3, of the aforementioned Legislative Decree no. 68 of 29 March 2012 consisting in the payment of a sum three times the amount received and the loss of the right to obtain other disbursements for the duration of the course of study, without prejudice in any event to the application of criminal law **provisions for acts constituting offences**.

In the event that the investigation shows that false statements have been made or false documents or documents containing false data have been produced, all benefits shall be revoked or recalculated and the sums unduly received or the lump-sum cost of the canteen service improperly used shall be recovered.

Article 11 - Forfeiture and exclusion from benefits

Forfeiture of benefits is envisaged for students who have not been granted the benefit in cash or in services, in the following cases:

- Students enrolled for the first time in the first year of Bachelor's degree courses, Master's degree courses, single-cycle Master's degree courses, Conservatories and Academy who by 30 November 2024 have not earned at least 20 credits (or at least 9 credits if students with disabilities as per article 5) who have not received the first instalment.
- Students enrolled for the first time in the first year of courses with exclusively annual examinations who have not received at least 10 credits by 30 November 2024.
- Students who are found to have university seniority beyond the period of eligibility for benefits.
- Students who hold a degree of the same level or higher, even if obtained abroad.
- Students who transfer to another university or abandon their studies for the academic year 2023/2024 on a date prior to 1 July 2024.
- Students who make false statements or have made false statements in previous years.
- Students who have not enrolled for the academic year in question by the deadlines set by the universities, Conservatoires and the Academy.
- Students enrolled in specialisation courses, with the exception of those in the medical area activated based on the relevant regulations, for a period exceeding the duration envisaged by the respective didactic regulations from the year of first enrolment.
- Students enrolled in PhD courses, who do not benefit from the scholarship referred to in Ministerial Decree no. 224 of 30 April 1999, for a period exceeding the duration envisaged by the respective teaching regulations starting from the year of first enrolment.

Students who have not closed the online application for benefits in all its modalities and procedures by the deadline will also be excluded from benefits.

Students who are recipients of other scholarships of more than EUR 1,500.00 (see art. 23 of this call) are excluded from receiving the scholarship alone.

In order not to incur forfeiture, students who find themselves in one or more of the above-mentioned cases must promptly notify ARDIS@certregione.fvg.it of their waiver of the benefit awarded and not disbursed.

In any case ARDIS excludes from benefits applicants who find themselves in one or more of the above-mentioned conditions based on the information that comes to its knowledge.

The call of forfeiture of benefits is published on the ARDIS institutional site; this communication is considered to be a legal notification.

SCHOLARSHIP

Deadline 25 August 2023 h. 1 p.m.

Article 14 - Application deadline and procedure

Students wishing to apply for the scholarship **must complete the online application and submit it by 1 p.m. (Italian Summer Time/GMT+2/UTC+2/CEST) on 25 August 2023** following the procedures set out in Article 6 of this call.

Article 15 - Status of students: on-site, commuter and off-site

The students' municipality of residence and the distance from the place of study concur in determining the status of beneficiary students, for the purposes of quantifying the amount of the scholarships, as follows:

15.1 EU Students

For EU students, the status on-site, commuter or off-site status for the purposes of this competition is defined in **Annex 1**. In order to qualify for the scholarship as an off-site student, students must also comply with the provisions of **Article 15.3** below.

15.2 Non-EU students

Non-EU students may be considered off-site **regardless of their residence in Italy**. Exceptions to this are students whose family unit resides in Italy or foreign students who form an autonomous family unit in Italy that is different from their original one: in these cases, residence in Italy is taken into account. In any case, non-EU students must comply with the provisions of **Article 15.3** below in order to be recognised as off-site students.

15.3 Off-site status

Students residing in municipalities considered to be off-site in Annex 1 are defined as "off-site" if:

- a. They declare online by the deadline that they will take accommodation (with a rental contract or otherwise in private or institutional accommodation) near the university site (i.e. in municipalities considered to be on-site in relation to the course location) for a period of no less than 10 months between 1 September 2023 and 31 August 2024.
- b. They use, against payment, the residential facilities of ARDIS for a period of not less than 10 months.

The limit of 10 months is reduced to 6 months:

- a. For final-year undergraduates, with regular status, who intend to take their degree examination by the last scheduled call for the academic year 2022/2023.
- b. For students enrolled in the additional semester housed in ARDIS Student Houses, with respect to the duration envisaged by the respective education regulations.

The online declaration for off-site status can be made:

- Within the **online application** by the deadline for individual benefits.

- In the dedicated online section "**rental contract data**", by **6 October 2023 at 1 p.m.** in order to be an off-site beneficiary in the final ranking.
- In the dedicated online section "**rental contract data**", by **30 November 2023 at 1 p.m.** - late communication - to be commuter beneficiaries in the final ranking (the first instalment of the grant will be as commuter student) and subsequently off-site in the ranking update (the second instalment of the grant will be supplemented with the total amount for off-site beneficiaries).

Students who were unable to complete the online application part concerning the rental contract, because they did not have all the required data, must declare online in the dedicated section "rental contract data" that they have been using the accommodation for at least 10 months, indicating the address, the monthly rent, the duration of the agreement, the expiry date and the registration details with Agenzia delle Entrate (Revenue Agency).

The "rental contract data" section can be completed indicatively from 1 September 2023.

Please note that the inclusion of a contract expiring before **6 October 2023** in the online application or in the dedicated "**rental contract data**" section does not allow for inclusion in the ranking as an off-site student. For example, a student who has a contract expiring on 30 September 2023 must necessarily enter the details of the new contract or the contract renewed for the following year.

Students who have an accommodation contract expiring in less than 10 months, and who wish to renew it or take out a new one, in order to confirm their off-site status, must send an email to info.trieste@ARDIS.fvg.it or info.udine@ARDIS.fvg.it with the details of the contract renewal or the new contract allowing them to reach the 10-month duration of accommodation against payment.

In the event of a change of address during the academic year, students must notify ARDIS immediately, as indicated above.

Students who have been **allocated accommodation** in the facilities made available by ARDIS for the academic year and have taken regular possession of the accommodation, do not have to submit the declaration regarding paid accommodation for the academic year 2023/2024.

If by **1 p.m. on 30 November 2023** all the details of the rental agreement duly registered with the Revenue Agency by that date have not been entered online, applicants, even if resident in municipalities considered to be off-site, will compete for the scholarship as "commuters".

Please note that the 10 months of paid accommodation must be counted in the period between **1 September 2023 and 31 August 2024**.

15.3.1 Contract for consideration

In order to be considered off-site, students must be in possession of a **duly signed and registered rental contract** for a property located in Italy, close to the university of the course of study location. The rental contract must be in the name of the student or co-signed by the student and a member of the household, or, in the case of students residing in public or private university boarding schools and colleges, a valid tax certificate relating to the payment of the rent, and must be communicated within the deadline and in the manner set out in Article 15.3 above. The lease must not relate to a property owned by a member of the student's household.

The monthly fee payable by students, net of utility costs (e.g. water, electricity, gas, telephone, etc.), cannot be **less than EUR 120.00**.

15.3.2 Trieste - Udine inter-university students

Students enrolled in an inter-university degree course between Trieste and Udine are required to declare, when applying online, the **prevailing educational venue** (at which they will take most of their examinations during the academic year), regardless of the administrative venue, for the purposes of determining their status as off-site, commuter or on-site students. At the end of the academic year, ARDIS will verify the location of the examinations and redetermine the amount of the benefit, if necessary.

Article 16 - Amounts

The amount of the grant was updated by Directorial Decree of the Ministry of Universities and Research no. 203 of 23 February 2023 and the maximum amounts of the grants are listed below:

- **EUR 6,656.52** for **off-site** and **independent** students.
- **EUR 3,889.99** for **commuter** students.
- **EUR 2,682.77** for **on-site** students.

The following cases are also envisaged:

1. For economically disadvantaged students defined as students with an ISEE indicator of less than or equal to half (EUR 13,153.13) of the maximum reference limit (EUR 26,306.25), the amount of the grant payable is increased by 15%.
2. For female students enrolled in courses concerning S.T.E.M. subjects, the amount of the grant payable is increased by 20%. This amount cannot be cumulated with the 15% increase provided for students with ISEE levels below 50% of the maximum reference limit and, therefore, the increase is calculated based on the value of the scholarship to which the student is entitled.
3. Ministerial Decree 1320/2021 states that a student enrolled at the same time in more than one study course is allowed to obtain and maintain the scholarship, increased by 20%, if he/she meets and maintains the merit requirements set out in this call for both study courses and for their entire duration. The 20% increase is not due in the event that the student loses the eligibility for the scholarship with respect to the course of study to which the student related the aforementioned increase. This 20% increase will be evaluated by ARDIS in consultation with the universities.

Undergraduate students (further semester) and students enrolled in the first additional year of the course are paid the scholarship in half the amount.

The grant is paid in full to students whose household ISEE for subsidised benefits related to the right to university education is less than or equal to 2/3 of the ISEE threshold for subsidised benefits for the right to university education indicated in art. 4.3 above. If the student's ISEE for subsidised benefits related to the right to university education exceeds 2/3 (equal to EUR 17,537.50) and up to the maximum amount of the ISEE threshold for subsidised benefits related to the right to university education, the amount of the grant is gradually reduced up to half the maximum amount of the total.

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The amount of the grant includes the use of accommodation services in the form indicated below.

For all grant recipients with the status of off-site students who are also allocated accommodation, the amount of the grant is reduced by:

- EUR 1,700.00 for the use of accommodation for 10 months.
- EUR 1,870.00 for the use of accommodation for 11 months.

For students awarded accommodation who graduate by December 2023, a **flat-rate amount of EUR 600.00** is deducted for the accommodation service.

For students awarded accommodation who graduate between January 2024 and April 2024, a **flat-rate amount of EUR 1,200.00** is deducted for the accommodation service.

The grant is exempt from income tax as provided for by Article 4 of Law no. 476 of 13 August 1984 "Provision on scholarships and PhDs in universities".

Article 17 - Tuition Fee Exemption

Students who are eligible or beneficiaries of the grant referred to in this call are **exempt from paying university fees for the academic year 2023/2024**.

Students whose scholarship is revoked, who renounce their scholarship or who forfeit their benefit, lose their right to tuition fee exemption and must therefore pay fees if due.

Article 18 - Regional tax for the right to university education

The application to take part in the competition shall also be considered as a formal application for exemption from payment of the regional tax for the right to university education referred to in Article 37 of Regional Law no. 21 of 14 November 2014. Eligible students or scholarship recipients are therefore exempt from this fee.

ATTENTION

Students whose scholarship is revoked, who renounce their scholarship or who forfeit their benefit, lose their right to exemption from the regional fee related to the right to university education and must therefore pay the fees due.

However, students with disabilities are exempt from paying the regional tax for the right to university education.

Article 19 - Allocation Reserves

The number of scholarships that will be granted is determined based on the proceeds deriving from the regional tax for the right to university education referred to in Article 37 of Regional Law no. 21 of 14 November 2014, the proceeds deriving from the Supplementary Intervention Fund referred to in Article 18, Chapter IV of Legislative Decree no. 68 of 29 March 2012, the Regional Supplementary Intervention Fund and the availability of its own funds in the ARDIS budget.

Scholarships and mobility scholarships from the a.y. 2023/2024 are financed under the NRRP by the European Union - Next Generation EU.

The resources available for the scholarships are allocated according to the following allocation reserves:

- 2% to students with disabilities.
- 6% of scholarships available to non-EU students.

After the above-mentioned reserves, the allocation is completed for all EU and non-EU students in the ranking lists for the years after the first.

The ranking list of EU students enrolled in the first year and then the ranking list of non-EU students enrolled in the first year will be completed.

Should the financial resources not be sufficient to fully cover the rankings, the resources will be allocated in proportion to the number of eligible students belonging to each ARDIS operational site.

Article 20 - Students enrolled at the School of Advanced Education of Udine or the Collegio Fonda

Students staying free of charge in the residences made available by the University of Udine School of Advanced Education and the Collegio Fonda in Trieste are not eligible for the grant to the extent provided for students considered to be off-site.

Article 21 - Rankings

Provisional rankings for scholarships are published indicatively by 28 September 2023. By the end of October, the final rankings are published on www.ARDIS.fvg.it

In the final rankings, only students who have entered the complete rental agreement data in the online application by **6 October 2023** are included with the off-site status.

In December ARDIS updates the status of students taking into account the rental data entered in the form by **30 November 2023**.

All students are included in the rankings published on the website with the **user code** in place of their name, in accordance with transparency/privacy provisions. This code is assigned to each student by the software when completing the online application and corresponds to the **last five digits of the "Application" code**. The code can be found in the student's private area under "Student Desk" or on the summary file of the submitted application.

Students can check the outcome of the rankings by accessing the online services within their reserved area under "Student Desk". The student is obliged to consult his or her reserved area periodically because the communications published there are considered legal notifications.

According to the modalities laid down in Articles 7 and 8 of the General Rules, separate rankings are drawn up in descending order of points:

- For EU students enrolled in the **first year** of all courses, including students enrolled at the Conservatoires and the Academy.
- For non-EU students enrolled in the **first year** of all courses, including students enrolled at the Conservatoires and the Academy.
- For EU and non-EU students enrolled in **years subsequent to the first**, divided by competent educational centres, including students enrolled at the Conservatoires and the Academy.
- For students enrolled in **specialisation courses**, with the exception of those in the medical area covered by Legislative Decree no. 368/1999.
- For students enrolled in **PhD courses** who do not benefit from a scholarship under Ministerial Decree no. 224 of 30 April 1999.

Article 22 - Payment

The grant is paid by **crediting** a national current account (IBAN IT) or a foreign account (ACCOUNT IDENTIFICATION CODE) in the name of the student or co-owned by the student or a prepaid card with IBAN IT in the name of the student or co-owned by the student.

Students must enter their **bank details** when completing the online application and can later supplement or modify them through the ARDIS online services. If the student has a foreign account, he/she must enter the BIC/SWIFT code, the name of the bank and the country in addition to the account identification code.

ATTENTION "Limits of Credit and Prepaid Cards"

Credit and prepaid cards have payment and withdrawal ceilings, which vary according to the regulations undersigned with the issuing institution. The student is therefore obliged to check whether his or her bank account or prepaid card has sufficient capacity to receive payment of any awarded grant. Please note that the payment of the grant cannot be split in any way.

The IBAN in the name of the student or co-owned by the student must be entered into the application for benefits **by 10 October 2023** at the latest; entries made after this date will make it impossible to credit the grant by the end of the 2023 financial year.

It should be noted that the **final verification** of the merit requirement and the correct calculation of university seniority takes place before payment of the grant's balance.

22.1 Students enrolled in the first year of bachelor's degree courses, master's degree courses and single-cycle master's degree courses

From the academic year 2023/2024, the monetary portion of the grant shall be disbursed, to the extent due, as follows for each academic course:

- 1) For **students enrolled in the FIRST YEAR OF THE FIRST LEVEL BACHELOR'S DEGREE COURSES OR DIPLOMAS AND SINGLE-CYCLE MASTER'S DEGREE COURSES:**
 - **First instalment of 20% of the net amount of the grant by 10 November 2023**, provided that enrolment is completed by the deadline for submitting applications for review of the scholarship;
 - **Second instalment for a further 30% of the net amount of the scholarship by 31 December 2023.**
 - **Third instalment equal to the remaining 50% of the net amount of the grant, paid from June, upon reaching at least 20 credits, duly registered in the Esse3 system, or in the Conservatoire and Academy databases (or at least 10 credits for courses with exclusively annual examinations) with a passing date no later than 10 August 2024.**

- 2) For students **enrolled in the FIRST YEAR OF THE MASTER'S DEGREE OR SECOND-LEVEL DIPLOMA COURSES:**
 - **First instalment equal to 50% of the net amount of the grant by 31 December 2023**, depending on admission to the courses in accordance with the didactic regulations and recognition of at least 150 CFUs (CFAs)
 - **Second instalment equal to the remaining 50% of the net amount of the grant, paid from June, upon achievement of at least 20 credits, duly registered in the Esse3 system, or in the Conservatoire and Academy databases (or at least 10 credits for courses with exclusively annual examinations) with a passing date no later than 10 August 2024.**

Students who will have achieved the merit requirement, with registration of the necessary credits, **after 10 August but by 30 November 2024**, will be subject to ex officio checks with the University, the Conservatoires and the Academy for the purpose of preserving the amount received **as a scholarship** (scholarship amount halved).

Failure to obtain the prescribed credits by 30 November 2024 will result in the revocation of the scholarship and other cash benefits already granted (Art. 24) and the return of any sums received in services.

22.2 Students enrolled in years following the first.

The monetary part of the scholarship is paid out as follows:

- **First instalment of 50% of the net amount of the grant by 31 December 2023**, provided that enrolment is completed by the deadline for submitting applications for review of the scholarship and that the IBAN is submitted.
- **Second instalment equal to the balance of the net amount of the scholarship by 30 June 2024**, after ex officio verification of the permanence of the requirements for **students enrolled in years subsequent to the first.**

If the student is **enrolled in the first additional year** (further semester) **and is allocated accommodation**, since he/she is entitled to half the amount of the scholarship, he/she will only receive a cash share if the amount of the scholarship itself, minus the accommodation service for the entire allocation period, is greater than zero. This tranche is paid in two equal instalments.

22.2.1 Undergraduate students

For final year beneficiaries, with regular status, who have declared in their online application that they intend to undergo the general graduation examination by the last scheduled call for the academic year 2022/2023, **the grant is disbursed in one lump sum by June 2024, only after the degree has been verified.**

For students awarded accommodation who graduate by December 2023, a **flat-rate** amount of **EUR 600.00** is deducted from the grant amount for the accommodation service.

For students awarded accommodation who graduate between January and April 2024, a **flat-rate** amount of **EUR 1,200.00** for accommodation service is deducted from the grant amount.

Students who, despite having completed the application as undergraduates, do **not succeed in obtaining their degree** will only receive the grant after enrolment for the academic year 2023/2024 (first additional year) and provided they meet the merit requirements set out in Article 4.

Students who, contrary to the provisions of Article 3.1.1, apply as students enrolled in subsequent years for the additional semester for the academic year 2023/2024, even if they graduate by the extraordinary session of the academic year 2022/2023 and will enrol in the first year of the Master's degree for the academic year 2023/2024 by the deadlines set by the universities and conservatoires, will receive the grant at half the amount provided for students enrolled in subsequent years for the additional semester.

22.3 Students enrolled in the first year of PhD and specialisation courses

For students enrolled in specialisation courses, with the exception of those in the medical area pursuant to Legislative Decree no. 368/1999, and PhD courses, who do not benefit from an academic scholarship, the first instalment of the grant is paid only upon **confirmation of enrolment** and the second instalment is paid in **June 2024**.

22.4 Suspension of Payments

For students included in the final rankings with the note: "**university enrolment to be ascertained**" the payment of the grant is made in the financial year 2024 after verification of enrolment.

Payment of the grant cannot be made to students for whom an ISEE with annotations, remarks or discrepancies has been found.

Regularisation of the above cases after the deadline for submitting applications for review will result in the grant being credited in the 2024 financial year.

Article 23 - Cumulation limit

ARDIS scholarships can be combined with other scholarships granted by public or private bodies provided they do not exceed EUR 1,500.00.

In the event that the student has declared in the online application that he/she is a beneficiary for the academic year 2023/2024 of another scholarship of an amount higher than EUR 1,500.00, he/she will be included in the relevant ranking as not eligible.

This limit does not apply to scholarships granted by national or foreign institutions aimed at supplementing training or research activities with stays in Italy or abroad, scholarships from international mobility programmes (e.g. Erasmus+), grants for international mobility provided by ARDIS, dissertation grants and accommodation grants. It also does not apply to students with disabilities.

Article 24 - Revocation

The scholarship is revoked from students who have been awarded the cash or service benefit if they fall into one of the following cases:

- Enrolled for the first time in the first year of the courses if they have not obtained at least 20 credits by 30 November 2024 (or at least 9 credits if students with disabilities as defined in Art. 5).
- Enrolled for the first time in the first year of courses with exclusively annual examinations if they have not obtained at least 10 credits by 30 November 2024.
- If the requirements for enrolment, merit, university seniority, income and assets are no longer met, following checks or reports received from universities or other public administrations.
- Having made false declarations or have presented false documents or documents containing false data.

- If they have obtained recognition of dual enrolment as set out in Article 16, point 3, the scholarship and any increase shall be revoked if the student loses the requirements set out in this call, with reference to the course of study to which the application for the scholarship is related;
- Having university seniority beyond the period of eligibility for benefits.
- Holding a degree of the same level or higher, even if obtained abroad.
- Transferring to another university or abandoning their studies for the academic year 2023/2024 on a date prior to 1 July 2024.

24.1 Revocation procedure

ARDIS communicates the start of the grant revocation procedure to students who are in one of the above positions. Within 10 days of the communication, students may send any counter-arguments to the address: ARDIS@certregione.fvg.it or by registered mail with return receipt to the writing administration. Should this deadline expire unsuccessfully, ARDIS will send the revocation measure to the person concerned, requesting, within 30 days of receipt of the communication, the return of the sum received.

The student may request that the amount due be paid in instalments in accordance with the procedures set out in Article 38-a of Regional Law no. 21/2014.

If repayment does not take place within the time limit, ARDIS proceeds to recover the sum in accordance with the procedures defined by current state legislation on direct tax collection, as provided for in Article 50 of Regional Law no. 7/2000.

Revocation entails:

- Repayment of unduly received sums.
- Payment of the cost of the accommodation service improperly used, as set out in Article 16.

In the event that the revocation of the grant has been determined by the **lack of requirements** as a result of the checks carried out by ARDIS and/or reports received from universities or other public administrations or the students have made false declarations or produced documents containing false data, the accommodation service will be calculated at the rate indicated in Article 37.3 for the allocation period.

First-year students who have been allocated accommodation and whose grant is revoked due to **failure to meet the merit requirement** must pay the fees set out in Article 35 for students allocated accommodation or the cost of the accommodation service as set out in Article 16 if they are accommodated for the entire academic year.

For students transferring to another university or withdrawing from studies for the academic year 2023/2024 before 1 July 2024, the accommodation service will be calculated at the rate indicated in Article 35 for the allocation period.

ATTENTION

If the scholarship is revoked, in addition to reimbursing the amount already disbursed, including in the form of accommodation services, students are required to reimburse the regional tax for the right to university education and to pay the full amount corresponding to university fees and contributions, returning any amounts already received from the University or ARDIS by way of reimbursement.

Article 25 - Students with disabilities (pursuant to Article 3(1) of Law no. 104 of 5 February 1992, and/or disability of 66% or more)

25.1 Amount

The scholarship is awarded partly in cash and partly in services.

If students are allocated accommodation in one of the Student Houses, part of the scholarship is provided in the form of accommodation services.

The amount of the grant was updated by Directorial Decree of the Ministry of Universities and Research no. 203 of 23 February 2023 and the maximum amounts of the grants are listed below:

- **EUR 8,653.48** for **off-site** students.
- **EUR 5,056.99** for **commuter** students.
- **EUR 3,187.60** for **on-site** students.

The scholarship is paid in the maximum amount indicated above to students whose household ISEE for subsidised benefits related to the right to university education is less than or equal to 2/3 of the ISEE threshold for subsidised benefits related to the right to university education indicated in point 5.3 above. If the student's ISEE threshold for subsidised benefits related to the right to university education is higher than 2/3 and up to the maximum amount of the ISEE threshold for subsidised benefits related to the right to university education, the amount of the scholarship is gradually reduced up to half the maximum amount.

The amount of the grant includes the use of accommodation services in the form indicated below.

For all grant recipients with the status of off-site students who are also allocated accommodation, the amount of the grant is reduced by:

- EUR 1,700.00 for the use of accommodation for 10 months.
- EUR 1,870.00 for the use of the accommodation for 11 months

For students who graduate by December 2023, a flat-rate of EUR 600.00 is deducted for the housing service.

For students awarded accommodation who graduate between January 2024 and April 2024, a flat-rate amount of EUR 1,200.00 is deducted for the accommodation service.

The grant is exempt from income tax as provided for by Article 4 of Law no. 476 of 13 August 1984 "Provision on scholarships and PhDs in universities".

25.2 Payment

From the academic year 2023/2024, the monetary portion of the grant shall be disbursed, to the extent due, as follows for each academic course:

- 1) For **students enrolled in the FIRST YEAR OF THE FIRST LEVEL BACHELOR'S DEGREE COURSES OR DIPLOMAS AND SINGLE-CYCLE MASTER'S DEGREE COURSES:**
 - **First instalment of 20% of the net amount of the grant by 10 November 2023**, provided that enrolment is completed by the deadline for submitting applications for review of the scholarship;
 - **Second instalment for a further 30% of the net amount of the scholarship by 31 December 2023.**
 - **third instalment equal to the remaining 50% of the net amount of the scholarship, paid from June, upon reaching of at least 9 credits, duly registered** in the Esse3 system, or in the Conservatoire and Academy databases with a **passing date no later than 10 August 2024.**

- 2) For students **enrolled in the first year of MASTER'S DEGREE OR SECOND-LEVEL DIPLOMA COURSES:**
 - **First instalment equal to 50% of the net amount of the grant by 31 December 2023**, depending on admission to the courses in accordance with the didactic regulations and recognition of at least 150 CFUs (CFAs)
 - **Second instalment equal to the remaining 50 % of the net amount of the grant, paid from June**, upon achievement of at least 9 credits, duly registered in the Esse3 system, or in the Conservatoire and Academy databases with a passing date no later than 10 August 2024.

Students who will have achieved the merit requirement, with registration of the necessary credits, **after 10 August but by 30 November 2024**, will be subject to ex officio checks with the University, the Conservatoires and the Academy for the purpose of preserving the amount received **as a scholarship** (scholarship amount halved).

Failure to obtain the prescribed credits by 30 November 2024 will result in the revocation of the scholarship and other cash benefits already granted (Art. 24) and the return of any sums received.

For **students enrolled in years following the first year**, the monetary share of the scholarship is paid as follows:

- **First instalment** of **50%** of the net amount of the scholarship **by 31 December 2023**, provided that enrolment is completed by the deadline for submitting applications for review of the scholarship.
- **Second instalment equal to the balance** of the net amount of the scholarship **by 30 June 2024** after verification of the permanence of the requirements.

If the student is **enrolled in the first additional year** (further semester) **and is allocated accommodation**, since he/she is entitled to half the amount of the scholarship, he/she will only receive a cash share if the amount of the scholarship itself, minus the accommodation service for the entire allocation period, is greater than zero. This tranche is paid in two equal instalments.

For final-year students, with regular status, who intend to take the general graduation examination by the last scheduled call for the academic year 2022/2023, the scholarship is disbursed in **one lump sum by June 2024, only after verifying their qualification.**

25.3 Cumulation limit

The limit on cumulation of the ARDIS scholarship with other scholarships under Article 23 does not apply to students with disabilities.

25.4 Revocation

For students with disabilities, the conditions for revocation set out in Article 24 shall apply.

25.5 Regional tax for the right to university education

Students with disabilities are exempt from paying the tax.

Accommodation places

Article 26 - Accommodation places

ATTENTION

Students benefiting from the housing service are entitled to an accommodation place **assigned ex officio** with an assessment of the best organisation of the housing service, taking into account the places available, the applicants' place of study, the position in the ranking and, where possible, the building preferences indicated by the student in the online application.

Housing beneficiaries may not elect to reside in student houses.

In order to guarantee the safety of students, ARDIS reserves the right to carry out transfers within the same residence or to another residence.

26.1 ACCOMMODATION FOR THE TRIESTE SITE

A total of **524** accommodation places are available, as follows:

- **472 accommodation places** at the Student Houses in Trieste (**71** in the E1 building, **181** in the E3 building, **121** in the E4 building and **99** in the Via Gaspare Gozzi building).
- **47 accommodation places** at the Student House in Gorizia (Palazzo De Bassa).
- **5 accommodation places** at the Student House in Pordenone.

26.1.2 Allocation priority

Only those enrolled in courses relating to the following can apply for a place in the Student House in Via Gaspare Gozzi:

- G. Tartini Conservatoire.
- Education Sciences, Social Service, Social Policy, Service Planning and Management, Humanities (in any case degree courses related to the Humanities department).
- School of Modern Languages for Interpreters and Translators.
- Medicine and surgery.

- Health professions.

26.1.3 Trieste - Student Houses (E1, E3 and E4)

Accommodation places are allocated, net of the reserves referred to in Article 28, as follows:

- **244 accommodation places** for students enrolled in years following the first.
- **110 accommodation places** for EU students enrolled for the first time in their first year.
- **11 accommodation places** for non-EU students enrolled for the first time in their first year.

Among the above-mentioned places, 11 places are equipped for students with disabilities as defined in Article 5: 4 places in Building E1, 5 places in Building E3 and 2 places in Building E4. Such places are allocated regardless of the municipality of residence. In any case, residents in the Municipality of Trieste are excluded.

26.1.4 Trieste - Via Gaspare Gozzi Student House

Accommodation places are allocated as follows:

- **66 accommodation places** for students enrolled in years following the first.
- **30 accommodation places** for EU students enrolled for the first time in their first year.
- **3 accommodation places** for non-EU students enrolled for the first time in their first year.

Among the above-mentioned places, 8 places are equipped for students with disabilities as defined in Article 5. Places are allocated regardless of the municipality of residence. In any case, residents in the Municipality of Trieste are excluded.

26.1.5 Gorizia

Accommodation places are allocated, net of the reserves referred to in Article 28, as follows:

- **32 accommodation places** for students enrolled in years following the first.
- **14 accommodation places** for EU students enrolled for the first time in their first year.
- **1 potable accommodation** for non-EU students enrolled for the first time in their first year.

Among the above-mentioned places, 1 place is equipped for disabled students as defined in Article 5. The place is allocated regardless of the municipality of residence. In any case, residents in the municipality of Gorizia are excluded.

26.1.6 Pordenone

Accommodation places are allocated as follows:

- **3 accommodation places** for students enrolled in years following the first.
- **1 accommodation place** for EU students enrolled for the first time in their first year.
- **1 accommodation place** for non-EU students enrolled for the first time in their first year.

26.2 ACCOMMODATION PLACES IN UDINE

A total of **350** accommodation places are available, as follows:

- **97 accommodation places** at the New Student House in Udine, Rizzi science centre.
- **89 accommodation places at Casa Burghart**
- **46 accommodation places** at the Student House in Gorizia (Palazzo De Bassa).
- **48 accommodation places** at the Student House in Pordenone; *
- **70 accommodation places** at the Student House in Gemona del Friuli.

*this number may be increased (+ 7 places) if maintenance work is completed in time for the allocations.

ATTENTION

Accommodation places at the New Student House at the Rizzi campus are allocated with priority to students enrolled in three-year and five-year science degree courses and students enrolled in the single-cycle degree course in Medicine and Surgery.

Accommodation places at the “Burghart” house residence in Viale Europa Unita are allocated with priority to students enrolled in courses in the humanities cluster, economics and law clusters and the health professions.

26.2.1 Udine - Rizzi science centre

Accommodation places are allocated as follows:

- **65 accommodation places** for students enrolled in years following the first.
- **3 accommodation places** for non-EU students enrolled for the first time in their first year.
- **29 accommodation places** for EU students enrolled for the first time in their first year.

Among the above-mentioned places, **four places** are equipped for disabled students as defined in Article 5. Accommodation places are allocated regardless of the municipality of residence. In any case, residents in the municipality of Udine are excluded.

26.2.2 Udine - Burghart House

Accommodation places are allocated as follows:

- **59 accommodation places** for students enrolled in years following the first.
- **3 accommodation places** for non-EU students enrolled for the first time in their first year.
- **27 accommodation places** for EU students enrolled for the first time in their first year.

Among the above-mentioned places, **1 place** is equipped for disabled students as defined in Article 5. The accommodation place is allocated regardless of the municipality of residence. In any case, residents in the municipality of Udine are excluded.

26.2.3 Gorizia

Accommodation places are allocated as follows:

- **31 accommodation places** for students enrolled in years following the first.
- **1 accommodation place** for non-EU students enrolled for the first time in their first year.
- **14 accommodation places** for EU students enrolled for the first time in their first year.

Among the above-mentioned places, **1 accommodation place** is equipped for disabled students as defined in Article 5. The place is allocated regardless of the municipality of residence. In any case, residents in the municipality of Gorizia are excluded.

26.2.4 Pordenone

Accommodation places are allocated as follows:

- **33 accommodation places** for students enrolled in years following the first.
- **1 accommodation place** for non-EU students enrolled for the first time in their first year.
- **14 accommodation places** for EU students enrolled for the first time in their first year.

Among the above-mentioned places, **three places** are equipped for disabled students as defined in Article 5. Places are allocated regardless of the municipality of residence. In any case, residents in the municipality of Pordenone are excluded.

26.2.5 Gemona del Friuli

Accommodation places are allocated as follows:

- **47 accommodation places** for students enrolled in years following the first.

- **2 accommodation places** for non-EU students enrolled in the first year at the Gemona del Friuli site;
- **21 accommodation places** for EU students enrolled for the first time in their first year.

Among the above-mentioned places, **two places** are equipped for disabled students as defined in Article 5. Places are allocated regardless of the municipality of residence. In any case, residents in the municipality of Gemona del Friuli are excluded.

26.2.6 Students with disabilities

Each residence has accommodation places equipped for the disabled.
If these places are not allocated, they will be allocated to students in the ranking list.

26.3 Grant for eligible students who are unable to take advantage of accommodation due to a lack of available places in the Student Houses.

Students **included in the definitive accommodation lists** as eligible non-beneficiaries, who are not offered accommodation even after the relevant lists have been exhausted, will be awarded an accommodation grant on condition that the students provide **by 6 October or, at the latest by 30 November 2023**, full details of a duly registered rental contract for at least 10 months in the didactic venue of the attended course, either with private individuals or with boarding facilities for the same duration.

The amount of the grant is set to a maximum of EUR 1,200.00 per year. The grant will be recalculated in the event of early termination of the contract. For this reason, the student is obliged to notify any changes to the rental contract as soon as possible.

This grant is not provided in the event of voluntary renunciation or non-acceptance of the accommodation space possibly allocated.

The provisional ranking of eligible students will be published by January 2024.

PLEASE NOTE: In order to obtain the grant, the eligible student is required to send the notification provided for in Article 15.3 by the deadline for the purposes of qualifying as an "off-site" student.

Article 27 - Specific Requirements

In addition to meeting the enrolment, merit, income and assets requirements set out in the general rules, students wishing to apply for accommodation at ARDIS Student Houses **must reside in one of the municipalities considered to be off-site in relation to the location of their course of study**, as set out in Article 15 of this call and in Annex 1.

Students with disabilities may still apply for an accommodation place, provided they are not resident in the municipality where the course is held.

Article 28 - Allocation modalities

The allocation will be carried out as follows:

- 2 accommodation places of which 1 in the E4 building in Trieste for the Trieste site and no. 1 in the Student House Polo Rizzi for the Udine site, for students lacking or without means, enrolled in the courses referred to in art. 2, who carry out high-level sports activities, as defined in the memorandum of understanding between MIUR, CRUI, CONI, CIP, CUSI and ANDISU no. 68 of 12/12/2016.
- 7 accommodation places in Trieste for students from Ukraine already recipients for the academic year 2022/2023 of the ARDIS-University-Conservatoire joint hosting initiative.

30% of the non-reserved places for each residence are allocated to EU students enrolled in the first year of all courses.

3% of the non-reserved places for each residence are allocated to non-EU students enrolled in the first year of all courses, guaranteeing at least 1 accommodation place per ranking. No more than 20% of eligible non-EU students may come from the same country, unless the ranking list is exhausted, guaranteeing at least 1 accommodation place per ranking list.

All accommodation places, net of the above-mentioned reserves, are allocated to students enrolled in subsequent years.

In addition to the accommodation places equipped for students with disabilities, further accommodation places are in any case allocated with priority to students with disabilities as defined in Article 5.

A minimum accommodation quota of 10% is guaranteed for non-EU students.

With regard to individual Student Houses, accommodation allocations are determined as set out in this Article.

Article 30 - Rankings

The rankings are prepared in accordance with Article 7 of the General Rules. The provisional and final rankings are separate for each deadline.

All students are entered in the ranking list published on the site with their **user code** instead of their first and last name, in order to meet transparency/privacy obligations. This code, assigned to each student by the software when filling in the online application, can be found in the student's reserved area called "Student Desk" or on the application summary file and corresponds to the **last five digits of the "Application" code**.

By accessing the online services of the ARDIS website, within the reserved area called "Student Desk", students can check the outcome of the rankings; beneficiaries can also view the university residence, and the room and date of assignment.

All beneficiary students who, for whatever reason, are unable to take possession of their allocated accommodation on the date indicated in their reserved area called "Student Desk" must send the deferred admission form, available on the ARDIS website, to alloggi.trieste@ARDIS.fvg.it or alloggi.udine@ARDIS.fvg.it according to the reference location, no later than two working days prior to the date of admission set out in the calendar.

Students who do not present themselves to take possession of the accommodation on the set days and at the set time and do not submit the appropriate deferred admission form within two working days prior to the day of admission are declared forfeited.

The non-acceptance of the accommodation place allocated ex officio by ARDIS entails the renunciation of the benefit for the academic year in question.

The accommodation places remaining available after the allocation to the beneficiaries, due to renunciation or forfeiture, will be assigned to the eligible persons favourably ranked in the relevant lists, according to the procedures that will be published on the ARDIS website.

30.1 Students enrolled in subsequent years

The provisional ranking of accommodation places for students enrolled in subsequent years is published on www.ARDIS.fvg.it **by 9 August 2023**.

The following rankings are drawn up for each university location, in descending order of points:

- For students enrolled in years subsequent to the first year of all the relevant teaching areas/campuses, including students enrolled at the Conservatoire and the Academy of Fine Arts (for the Udine site).
- For students enrolled in specialisation courses, with the exception of those in the medical area covered by Legislative Decree no. 368/1999.
- For students enrolled in PhD courses who do not benefit from a scholarship under Ministerial Decree no. 224 of 30 April 1999.
- For students with disabilities.

Students applying as students enrolled in subsequent years for the additional semester, if they obtain their degree by the extraordinary session of the academic year 2022/2023 and subsequently enrol in the first year of the Master's degree for the academic year 2023/2024, by the deadlines set by the University and the Conservatoire, will in any case only be granted accommodation until they obtain their three-year degree.

Please refer to Article 9 of this call with regard to any requests for review.

30.2 Students enrolled in the first year

The provisional ranking of accommodation places for students enrolled in the first year of all courses is published on www.ARDIS.fvg.it **by 5 September 2023**.

The following rankings are drawn up for each university location, in descending order of points:

- For EU students enrolled for the first time in their first year.
- For non-EU students enrolled for the first time in their first year.
- For students with disabilities enrolled for the first time in their first year.

Please refer to Article 9 of this call with regard to any requests for review.

Article 31 - Admissions

Admissions of students benefiting from accommodation take place according to a timetable in which beneficiaries are called to the assigned residences over several days. When the final ranking list for accommodation is published, the student is notified in the "Ranking Results" section within the reserved area called "Student Desk" of the day and time when he/she must present him/herself at the allocated Student House. Any changes to dates, due to organisational requirements, are published in good time at www.ARDIS.fvg.it and within the student's own "Student Desk" reserved area.

Beneficiary students in the ranking list must present themselves on the admission day indicated in their reserved area called "Student Desk" and bring with them:

- **A legible photocopy of a valid** identification document (accompanied by the original document). **Non-EU** students **must bring** with them **a passport** or **other** official identity document.
- **A passport photo.**

At the time of admission, the student signs the accommodation acceptance, provided by ARDIS, in which he or she declares to have read the "Rules for the use of the accommodation service in student residences", available on the website www.ARDIS.fvg.it, and undertakes to scrupulously comply with the rules contained therein.

PLEASE NOTE: Failure to show up on the allocation day without justification, or failure to submit the late admission form by the indicated deadline, will result in the automatic irrevocable renouncement of the benefit.

The non-acceptance of the accommodation place allocated ex officio by ARDIS entails the renunciation of the benefit itself for the academic year in question.

Students allocated accommodation for the **academic year 2023/2024 in the case of allocation by means of a deferred admission form** must, except for proven reasons of force majeure, present themselves at the concierge's desk of the Student House of assignment **within 1 month** of the scheduled date of admission to sign the acceptance, and related documentation, of the accommodation place, **under penalty of forfeiting the right to the benefit**. Situations of impediment must be reported promptly to alloggi.trieste@ARDIS.fvg.it or alloggi.udine@ARDIS.fvg.it according to the ARDIS site of reference.

The student is allocated accommodation for the academic year 2023/2024 **from the date of admission set out in this call until 31 July 2024** (*check-out must take place by 9.00 a.m. on 1 August 2024*).

Students allocated accommodation are obliged to follow the rules set out in the **Unified Regulation for the use of the accommodation service in student residences** and in the Regulation on the **criteria and procedures for the temporary and occasional use of halls and other common areas in residences** both of which can be consulted at www.ARDIS.fvg.it.

The students will provide themselves with the necessary crockery and cookware for the use of the kitchen.

All guests of the Student Houses are required to actively participate in the meetings periodically promoted and organised by ARDIS, as well as in the meeting to illustrate the Unified Regulation for the use of the housing service in the Student Houses.

With reference to the safety regulations in force, ARDIS will identify a suitable number of people among the beneficiary students who will carry out the task of **Emergency Management Officer**.

With the accommodation allocation, beneficiary students assume the obligation to attend in full the **training courses for Emergency Management officers on First Aid (lasting 12 hours) and on Fire Prevention and Protection at Medium Risk (lasting 8 hours)**, which will be held approximately during the month of November and will make it possible to train the Emergency Management teams. The courses will be attended by volunteering students or, in the event that the number of volunteers for each floor is insufficient, ARDIS will appoint ex officio the students required to attend these courses. All assignees must therefore make themselves available to take on this role. It is the responsibility of ARDIS to provide the necessary information and training to carry out the task, as well as the appropriate equipment.

ATTENTION

Students intending to enrol in the first year and who have been allocated accommodation in a Student House

should **immediately notify** alloggi.trieste@ARDIS.fvg.it or alloggi.udine@ARDIS.fvg.it, depending on the location in question, of their failure to pass any entrance tests and of their **possible renunciation of accommodation** in the event of non-enrolment in a degree course. These students are in any case required to pay the fees for the period of the accommodation assignment.

Students who, on the date of admission, owe ARDIS for accommodation fees or amounts to be repaid, are suspended from eligibility until they have settled their administrative obligations with ARDIS, unless they are repaying in instalments.

Article 32 - Renunciations

Students who decide to permanently renounce their accommodation place must notify ARDIS by sending the appropriate form available on the ARDIS website at alloggi.trieste@ARDIS.fvg.it or alloggi.udine@ARDIS.fvg.it, according to the place of reference, **within 15 days prior to the date from which the renunciation will take effect: the effects of the renunciation will take effect from the date indicated on the aforementioned form and in any case not before 15 days from the date of the communication.**

Students who are not scholarship recipients are required to pay the fees for the period to which the renunciation relates if they are late in communicating the same. It is understood that, in any case, the student accommodated in a Student House is obliged to pay the relevant fees until the definitive renunciation is notified. If the renunciation takes effect after the 15th day of the month in question, students who definitively renounce their accommodation are required to pay the full monthly fee. If the effective date of the renunciation falls on or before the 15th day of the relevant month, students are required to pay half of the monthly fee.

ATTENTION

Exclusively with regard to the renunciation of accommodation for the month of July, the renunciation notice, also in the case of graduation, must be received no later than 15 May 2024. Otherwise, the accommodation withholding fee referred to in Article 35 below for 11 months will be applied.

Students who, in the course of the academic year, complete their degree, irrevocably renounce their studies or move to another university location, **must vacate their accommodation within the terms and procedures set out in the Unified Regulations for the use of the student housing service**, notifying ARDIS of the date of their definitive renunciation of accommodation. Such notification must be made **within 15 days prior to the date from which the renunciation will take effect**, by sending the appropriate form available on the ARDIS website at alloggi.trieste@ARDIS.fvg.it or alloggi.udine@ARDIS.fvg.it.

Article 33 - Closure of Student Houses

During the Christmas period, the residences will remain open, unless otherwise determined by student attendance.

The Student Houses are closed during the month of August. During this period, accommodation will in any case be guaranteed in accordance with the procedures to be determined by ARDIS for students who have real logistical difficulties and who make a justified request for accommodation, in accordance with the terms and procedures governed by a specific notice published on the site. Students will have to pay the fee for students with enrolment-only status.

ARDIS may also provide for additional periods of closure due to justified and serious needs and in correspondence with periods of suspension of teaching activities, which will be promptly communicated.

Article 34 - Deposit

For the academic year 2023/2024, there is no deposit to be paid for the beneficiaries of the accommodation referred to in this call.

Article 35 - Accommodation fees

Scholarship recipients

If the **students awarded** accommodation are also scholarship recipients, the amount of the scholarship is reduced on a lump-sum basis by an amount equal to:

- **EUR 1,700.00** for the use of accommodation for 10 months.
- **EUR 1,870.00** for the use of accommodation for 11 months.

For **undergraduate students who are allocated** accommodation a flat-rate reduction from the housing service scholarship is applied as indicated below:

- **EUR 600.00** if they graduate by December 2023.
- **EUR 1,200.00** if they graduate between January 2024 and April 2024.

Non-scholarship recipients

Students who benefit from accommodation but do **not receive a scholarship** must pay the following subsidised monthly fee:

The accommodation fee is monthly and is not determined on a daily basis. Students who take possession of accommodation in the second half of the month pay half the monthly fee.

Students who have applied as master's degree freshmen but do not actually enrol in a master's degree programme for the academic year 2023/2024, if they do not meet the merit requirement as at 10 August 2023 as an additional semester, **forfeit the benefit of accommodation** and must pay the fees envisaged for **students with the enrolment-only status** for the entire period of their stay in the Student House (see art. 37.3).

In the event that the scholarship is revoked, ARDIS may possibly allow students to stay in the Student House in accordance with the arrangements for students with the enrolment-only status, subject to settlement of past debt.

Article 36 - Revocation and forfeiture of accommodation

The benefit of the accommodation place is revoked from beneficiary students in the cases provided for in the **Unified Regulation for the use of the student housing service**, which can be viewed on the ARDIS website.

The most frequent cases include:

- Non-payment of 3 accommodation fees, even if not consecutive.
- Lack of the required enrolment, merit, university seniority, income and assets, following checks carried out by ARDIS or reports received from the University or other public administrations.
- Submission of false declarations or production of documents containing false data.
- Violations of safety rules.

Revocation of the accommodation place due to failure to meet the requirements set out in this call will result in the request for payment of fees at the rate for students with enrolment-only status. First-year students who have been allocated accommodation and whose scholarship is revoked due to failure to meet the merit requirement must pay the fees set out in Article 35 or the cost of the accommodation service as set out in Article 16 if allocated for the entire academic year.

For students transferring to another university or withdrawing from studies for the academic year 2023/2024 before 1 July 2024, the accommodation service will be calculated at the rate indicated in Article 35 for the allocation period.

The assignee forfeits the benefit of the accommodation place in the cases provided for in Article 11 of this call and in the **Unified Regulation for the use of the student accommodation service**.

Article 37 - Students with enrolment-only status

If, after the allocation of accommodation places to eligible students in the related rankings referred to in Article 30, and after the activation of the reserves set aside for incoming international mobility students, accommodation places are still available, these places will be made available to students who meet the enrolment-only requirement.

Notices concerning any available accommodation places in the Student Houses are published on the ARDIS portal with activation of the relevant online application.

An exception is the Student House in Gemona del Friuli for which the online application must be completed by 1 p.m. (Italian Summer Time/GMT+2/UTC+2/CEST) on 8 September 2023. At the Gemona site, the admissions of accommodation assignees will be held on the days that will be published on the site in good time and, in any case, indicatively from 2 October 2023.

By completing the online application, the student provides a simple expression of interest, which must be finalised by sending the application in paper format, duly stamped (EUR 16.00 stamp duty) and signed. The application must be sent to ARDIS@certregione.fvg.it by 15 September 2023.

The possible activation date of the relevant online application for sites other than Gemona will be indicated at a later date on the website www.ARDIS.fvg.it.

ATTENTION

Students found to be ineligible in the ranking lists for the allocation of accommodation places due to lack of enrolment, merit, income and assets requirements **are NOT automatically included in the ranking list for accommodation places for students meeting the enrolment-only requirement.**

These students must therefore complete the online application for accommodation with an enrolment-only status by the deadline set for each Student House for sites other than Gemona, according to the calendar that will subsequently be published on the ARDIS website.

Only if the number of applications exceeds the actual availability of accommodation will two separate rankings be drawn up, one for subsequent years and one for freshmen, PhD and postgraduate students, according to the criteria specified below.

Places will be allocated with priority to students with disabilities.

The number of beneficiaries is determined by allocating, for each ranking, the same proportion of accommodation places, until the available places are exhausted.

ARDIS will be able to draw from the aforementioned rankings until the date indicated when they are published.

37.1 Students enrolled in years subsequent to the first

The ranking takes into account only university merit and is formulated by taking into consideration the examinations taken and registered in the career in the Esse3 system by 10 August 2023, with the following formula:

$$\text{punteggio} = \frac{\text{crediti registrati}}{60 \times \text{anni di iscrizione}}$$

37.2 Students enrolled in the first year, PhD and specialisation courses

The ranking takes into account the final grade with which students completed the course of study preceding the one they are enrolled in, on a scale of 1 to 100. For example, in the case of students enrolled in the first year of a

bachelor's degree course, the grade obtained in the baccalaureate exam is taken into account (converted to a scale of 1 to 100 if it is not already expressed in hundredths). In the case of students enrolled, for example, in the first year of master's degree courses, the grade obtained in the final exam is taken into account and converted on a scale of 1 to 100.

37.3 Accommodation fees for students with the enrolment-only status

Only if the health situation permits, and if accommodation is available in a double room, not already allocated as a double room for single use, will it be possible to allocate double rooms. As far as fees are concerned, they are determined as follows:

37.4 Methods of payment of accommodation fees

Accommodation fees must be paid by the 5th day of the relevant month, indicating as the reason for payment the month to which the fee refers, using the PagoPA payment system.

Article 38 - Application deadline and procedure

Applications for accommodation grants must be received by ARDIS **no later than 13:00 (Italian Summer Time/GMT+2/UTC+2/CEST)** on 25 August 2023, in accordance with the procedures set out in Article 6 of this call.

Article 39 - Grants

For students enrolled on study courses based in Portogruaro, Bolzano, Verona and Conegliano, where ARDIS does not directly manage a university residence, ARDIS grants an annual contribution of **EUR 1,200.00**, against a duly registered rental contract.

10 contributions are being offered for each study location.

Article 40 - Specific Requirements

In addition to meeting the enrolment, merit, income and assets requirements set out in the general rules, students applying for accommodation grants must also meet the following specific requirements:

- Must be registered for the academic year 2023/2024 to degree courses at the University of Trieste **in Portogruaro** or to degree courses at the University of Udine **in Conegliano, Bolzano and Verona**.
- Must be resident in one of the municipalities **considered to be off-site**, in relation to the location of their course of study, as set out in article 15.3 of this call and in Annex 1; for the Bolzano and Verona sites, applicant students must be resident in one of the municipalities at least 50 km from these cities.
- Must be provided with accommodation under a **rental contract**, as stipulated in Article 15.3 of this call.

Students must declare the actual use of the accommodation for consideration for **at least 10 months (counted in the period between 1 September 2023 and 31 August 2024)** in the vicinity of the university campus (**i.e. the municipalities considered in relation to the course location**), indicating online the details of the rental contract (duration, expiry date, rent and registration details). Students who have an existing contract with a shorter expiry date and who wish to renew it or enter into a new one are still considered eligible for the contribution, but they must necessarily notify ARDIS (by sending an email to info.trieste@ARDIS.fvg.it or info.udine@ARDIS.fvg.it) of the details of the contract renewal or of the new contract entered into to enable them to reach the 10-month duration of accommodation against payment.

The monthly fee payable by the student, net of utility costs (e.g. water, electricity, gas, telephone, etc.), **cannot be less than EUR 120.00**.

Students who, when completing the online application, have not declared to have taken possession of accommodation for consideration, are required to subsequently declare online in the appropriate section "Rental contract details", and in any case **by 1 p.m. of 30 November 2023**, the use of the accommodation for consideration for at least 10 months in the period from 1 September to 31 August 2024, indicating the address of the accommodation itself, located near the university campus, the monthly rent paid, the duration of the contract, the expiry date and the registration details of the same.

The "Rental contract data" section will be available indicatively from 1 September to 06 October 2023.

Article 41 - Rankings

The provisional ranking list for housing contributions is published on www.ARDIS.fvg.it by 15 February 2024.

All students are included in the ranking list in PDF format published on the site with the **user code** in place of the name, for transparency/privacy requirements. This number, assigned to each student by the software when filling in the online application, can be found in their reserved area called "Student Desk" or in the PDF file summarising the application: it is the last five digits of the "Application" code.

By accessing ARDIS online services, within their reserved area called "Student Desk", students can check the outcome of the rankings.

In accordance with the procedures set out in Articles 7 and 8 of the General Rules, the following rankings will be drawn up in descending order of points, broken down by course venue:

- Students enrolled for the first time in their first year
- Students enrolled in years subsequent to the first.

Priority is given to students enrolled in years subsequent to the first.

Article 42 - Payments

The contribution is paid by crediting a national current account (IBAN IT) or a foreign account (ACCOUNT IDENTIFICATION CODE) in the name of the student or co-owned by the student or by a prepaid card with IBAN IT in the name of the student or co-owned by the student.

Students must enter their bank details when competing the online application and can later supplement or modify them through the ARDIS online services. Revocation shall entail the recovery of the sums unduly received.

Students who find themselves in any of the above positions will be notified by ARDIS of the start of the procedure to revoke the accommodation contribution. Article 44 - Application deadline and procedure

The international mobility grant application may **only** be completed **by eligible students or recipients of a scholarship for the academic year 2023/2024 indicatively from 4 March to 8 April 2024, by 1.00 p.m. (Italian Summer Time/GMT+2/UTC+2/CEST)**, in accordance with the procedures set out in Article 6 of this call.

Article 45 - Contributions

International mobility scholarships are reserved for eligible students or scholarship recipients for the academic year 2023/2024 who participate for the same academic year in **study and training periods abroad**, already funded and promoted by the University of Trieste, the University of Udine, the "G. Tartini" Music Conservatoire of Trieste, the "J. Tomadini" Music Conservatoire of Udine and the "G. B. Tiepolo" Academy of Fine Arts in Udine, both within the framework of programmes promoted by the European Union and of programmes, including non-EU programmes (bilateral agreements), provided that the period of study and/or internship has academic recognition in terms of credits, as part of one's course of study in Italy, even if for the purposes of the final examination.

The grant for international mobility is **EUR 600.00 on a monthly basis** for the duration of the stay abroad, up to a maximum of ten months, irrespective of the country of destination, and may **only** be granted once **per higher education course**.

The amount of the mobility grant of EUR 600.00 on a monthly basis is deducted from the amount of the scholarship awarded from the funds of the Universities, the Conservatoires and the Academy of Fine Arts, the European Union or any other bilateral agreement, including non-EU ones.

Round-trip travel expenses made using public transport are reimbursed up to the amount of EUR 100.00 for European countries and up to the amount of EUR 500.00 for non-European countries, if the relevant reimbursement is not already provided for by the University or the Conservatoire, subject to uploading the relevant supporting documents through the online procedure that will be activated after the publication of the provisional ranking list.

The period of stay abroad is verified with the above institutions and for each full month of stay, conventionally calculated as 30 days, the full monthly contribution is paid, while for periods of less than one month the contribution will correspond to the days actually spent abroad.

No contribution is granted for **mobility periods carried out online from Italy** as part of study or training programmes promoted by the University of Trieste, the University of Udine, the "G. Tartini" Music Conservatoire of Trieste, the "J. Tomadini" Music Conservatoire of Udine and the "G. B. Tiepolo" Academy of Fine Arts of Udine. The international mobility grant is paid within the limits of the available resources and, if necessary, reduced in order to meet the widest possible number of applicant students.

Article 46 - Specific Requirements

In addition to meeting the enrolment, merit, income and asset requirements set out in the general rules, students wishing to receive international mobility grants must:

- **Participate exclusively during the academic year 2023/2024 in study or internship periods abroad** promoted by the University of Trieste, the University of Udine, the "G. Tartini" Music Conservatoire of Trieste, the "J. Tomadini" Music Conservatoire of Udine, the "G. B. Tiepolo" Academy of Fine Arts of Udine for participation in international mobility programmes, both under programmes promoted by the European Union and under non-EU programmes (bilateral agreements).
- **Be a beneficiary of the scholarship** referred to in this call in the academic year 2023/2024.
- **The period of study or internship in question must have academic recognition in terms of credits within the course of study in Italy.**

Applicant students must declare in the online application to be recipients of an international mobility or work placement scholarship abroad for the academic year 2023/2024 and the related period of stay abroad determined at the time of the assignment by the University, Conservatoire or Academy. They must also declare to have not obtained an ARDIS scholarship for international mobility for the same course of study.

Any notifications concerning the extension of the study period abroad, if received after the deadline for submitting the application, will only be taken into consideration if they are communicated by the deadline for submitting applications for review.

ATTENTION

This code, assigned to each student by the software when filling in the online application, can be found in the student's reserved area called "Student Desk" or on the application summary file and corresponds to the last five digits of the "Application" code.

By accessing ARDIS online services, within their reserved area called "Student Desk", students can check the outcome of the rankings.

In accordance with the procedures set out in Articles 7 and 8 of the General Rules, the following rankings are drawn up in descending order of points, broken down by course location:

- Students enrolled for the first time in their first year
- Students enrolled in years subsequent to the first.

Priority is given to students enrolled in years after the first, subject to ARDIS budget availability.

In the event of equal merit, preference is given to students with a lower ISEE.

Article 48 - Payments

The grant is paid by crediting a national current account (IBAN IT) or a foreign account (ACCOUNT IDENTIFICATION CODE) in the name of the student or co-owned by the student or by a prepaid card with IBAN IT in the name of the student or co-owned by the student.

Students must enter their bank details when competing the online application and can later supplement or modify them through the ARDIS online services. If the student has a foreign account, he/she must enter the BIC/SWIFT code, the name of the bank and the country in addition to the account identification code.

The grant is paid only for the months authorised and already financed from the funds of the Universities, the Conservatoires and the Academy of Fine Arts, the European Union, or other bilateral agreement, including non-EU ones, in the amount of EUR 600.00 on a monthly basis for the duration of the stay abroad, up to a maximum of ten months, certified by the Universities, the Conservatoires and the Academy of Fine Arts promoting the

mobility programme, regardless of the country of destination. The amount of the mobility grant awarded from these funds is deducted from the amount of the mobility contribution.

The international mobility grant is disbursed as follows:

- For **students enrolled in years following the first** in two instalments:
 - **50% of the amount within 60 days** of the publication of the final ranking list provided that the mobility period has already started.
 - The remaining part of the scholarship, including reimbursement of travel expenses, **at the actual end of the period abroad**, subject to verification of the recognition of credits related to the mobility period. ARDIS reserves the right to disburse the contribution in a single instalment.
- For **students enrolled in the first year of courses after the achievement of merit** (20 CFUs or 10 CFUs for courses with exclusively annual examinations) **at the actual end of the period abroad**, subject to verification of the recognition of credits related to the mobility period:
 - **The full amount of the grant** for those who achieve the required credits by 10 August 2024.
 - The **amount of the grant halved** for those who achieve the required credits between 10 August and 30 November 2024.
- For **students with disabilities as referred to in Art. 5** upon achievement of at least 9 credits:

- Who renounce their ARDIS scholarship.
- Who have already received an international mobility scholarship for the same course of study.

Revocation shall entail the recovery of the sums unduly received.

Students in any of the above positions will be notified by ARDIS of the start of the procedure to revoke their international mobility scholarship. Within 10 days of the communication, students may send to ARDIS, at the address: ARDIS@certregione.fvg.it or by registered letter with return receipt to be addressed to the writing administration, any counter-arguments. Once this deadline has expired unsuccessfully, ARDIS will transmit the consequent revocation measure to the person concerned, requesting the return of the sum received within 30 days of receipt of the communication.
